Meeting with An Comisiún 6 Rinne Gaelacha  
6. Sraid Fearchar, Óc Cliach.

19<sup>th</sup> July 1979.

A second meeting of An Comisiún, and An Comhdháil was held at number 6 Harcourt St Dublin, on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> July 1979. The following members represented An Comisiún.

Miss Bastable apologised on behalf of Miss Anna Mc Coy Belfast, Miss Peg O'Leary Cork, Miss Mary McLaughlin Derry, she said that this meeting had been called at very short notice, and she was unable to contact these people, she felt that we could not agree to anything of a serious matter as it would be unfair to our teachers, who, through no fault of their own were not present at the meeting. Mr Mac DonaghUSA in reply said, that he had instructed his secretary to phone Mr

O'Connor, the previous week, when he was away, this she failed to do, and he thought that as we had agreed to meet, prior to the summer recess this was the only time there seemed to be. In the absence of Mr O'Dalaigh (Chairman) nobody was appointed to chair the meeting, so all delegates merely had a discussion on the points that were written on the paper that Mr Mac Giolla Phadraig handed out to those present.

#### Point Number 1.

An Comhdháil would have the right to retain their association, and through it negotiate on behalf of its members.

Mr McLeamy said a lot of consideration would have to be given to this matter, he asked what would happen if a member of An Comhdháil was in good standing with that organisation, but refused to join An Comhairle? he said according to our Constitution, they (the member) would have the right to remain a member of An Comhdháil, without signing their name with An Comhairle, he wondered if the majority of people wanted unification, but a few opted out, yet still wanted An Comhdháil, how would we get around this situation, Miss Walsh, thought in a situation like this, it would be better if we disbanded An Comhdháil, joined forces, and then immediately set up a new teachers Association, she did not think that then we could be held legally

to the present Constitution. Mr De Gháil said that at no time would the Commission be prepared to go to law on any issue. Mr Paddy O'Connor said he had not come to this meeting to waste time, he wanted the members of the Commission present, to know that An Comhairle wanted full recognition for all its members, the matter of the Constitution he said was our problem and he did not think it should be discussed, Mr McLeamy disagreed with Mr O'Connor on this issue and said it was a very serious matter, which everybody would have to think about. No solution to point number one was reached.

### Point Number 2.

All Feiseanna now registered with An Comhairle to be accepted for registration with An Comhairle, and if necessary allowed to operate side by side.

### Point number 3

All registered Teachers and Adjudicators, have the right to participate in all registered Feiseanna.

These two points did not come in for a lot of discussion, as, we all agreed that these points would only be relevant, if and when unity was achieved.

Point number 4.

Full recognition be given to the results of Examinations of Dr Comhdháil, and Teachers and Adjudicators qualified by that Body.

This was agreed to by both sides.

Point number 5.

Greater representation be given to Teachers, in Relation to members after re-unification.

On point number five, a discussion arose regarding members of the Examination Panel. Mr De Gháil said that they were not in agreement with equal representation regarding Exams. He said that we had ten Examiners and they had only six, full panel members, Mr Bolter doubted this, and Mr Mac Con Ullad, went on to explain that they had in addition to their 6 full members they had six reservers, and a number of others who were selected from time to time. Mr Mac Con Ullad asked Mr O'Connor for the names of our Examiners, when these were issued, Mr Mac Con Ullad said that he did not think that Miss Anna O'Coy and Miss Mary O'Laughlin had ever sat on a Panel of Examiners with The Irish Dancing Commission. Miss Bostable said that they themselves had told Mr Mac Con Ullad that they had sat on exams, in fact they mentioned that they had sat on some exams with Comhdháil's Ullad, which at the time was

connected ~~with~~ Mr Commissie in Dublin, Mr MacGowan said he doubted this, but he would check it out, Mr Bolton asked about their reserve panel members, and how were they selected, also did they sit or all exams. Miss Bastable said on the question of numerical numbers, we did not break down our panel into full time and reserves, therefore we were smaller in number than the Commissie. Mr de Bláil said we should consider selecting six out of our ten members and the other four could go as reserve. This was not agreed to by the members of An Chomhdháil who were present.

Following the talk on the 5 points handed to us by Mr Mac Dougusa, a discussion took place, on a possible date for reunification. Mr O'Leary said he could not envisage unity before the end of 1980, he said we could not rush into something that had taken 10 years to achieve. Mr de Bláil said he would like to see both sides agreeing on a specific date for unity, he saw no point in talking on without coming to something concrete, he said he would like to see January 1<sup>st</sup> 1980 as a possible date for unity.

This concluded talks, and no other date was agreed to before September 1979. Mr O'Connell, said we would be having our Conference in August, and he cordially invited any of the Commissie members present to attend our Ceili Ball if they wished to come.
